DISABLED PERSONS PARKING BY-LAW NO. 7171/98

A Bylaw of THE CITY OF WINNIPEG respecting Parking by Persons who are Physically Disabled.

THE CITY OF WINNIPEG, in Council assembled, enacts as follows: amended 8162/2002

- 1(1) Unless otherwise expressly provided or unless the context otherwise requires, words and expressions in this by-law have the same meaning as the same words and expressions in *The Highway Traffic Act* of the Province of Manitoba.
- 1(2) In this by-law

"**permit**" means a physically disabled person's parking permit issued under Section 124.3 of *The Highway Traffic Act*.

2(1) No person shall stop, stand or park a motor vehicle in a designated parking space or in a manner that makes a designated parking space inaccessible unless a permit is displayed in the vehicle and is used in accordance with *The Highway Traffic Act* and the regulations under that Act.

2(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), where a permit is not displayed in the vehicle but would have been used in accordance with The Highway Traffic Act and regulations under that Act if it had been displayed, the person is guilty of an offence and liable, upon summary conviction, to a fine set out in the Voluntary Payment of Fines By-law.

- 3(1) Where it is alleged by a peace officer that any person has contravened the provisions of Section 2 hereof, that person, on being notified of the allegation may voluntarily consent to pay the penalty for the contravention fixed by and in accordance with the procedure, and to such person, as is stated in the by-law of the City to permit the voluntary payment of penalties out of Court for contravention of by-laws of the City respecting parking and traffic.
- Where payment has been made as provided in Subsection (1) of this Section, there shall be no prosecution for the contravention in respect of which payment has been made.
- 4. Any person who contravenes the provisions of Section 2 hereof is guilty of an offence and liable, upon summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding \$1,000.00 in the case of an individual or \$5,000.00 in the case of a corporation or, in the case of an individual, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or both such a fine and imprisonment.
- 5. This By-law shall be referred to as the "Disabled Persons Parking By-law".
